E. Excelsior Springs Educational Foundation Report

1. Educational Foundation Report

Executive Director, Courtney Cole, presented the following update on the Educational Foundation:

- a. Three teacher grants have recently been awarded: Flexible seating for the Middle School, Rockin' Tiger Club - robotics kit, and Animediators Showcase for the Career Center.
- b. Chuck Anderson Ford is sponsoring the Valedictorian Scholarship again this year in the amount of \$2,000 and the Foundation is sponsoring the Salutatorian Scholarship of \$1,000.
- c. Tiger Fest 2018 was a very successful event with an 87.1% in satisfied responses to the feedback survey. Next year's Tiger Fest will be held on April 12, 2019.

F. Visitors' Forum

Doug Richey addressed the Board to present his platform for the State Representative seat (38th District) that he is running for in the next election.

G. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Hoehn presented his Superintendent's Report which included the following:

- a. The FY19 State Budget is being finalized by the Senate and House in Conference. Indicators point to fully funding the Foundation Formula with a \$98 million increase and a \$10 million increase to Transportation.
- b. Baccalaureate is Wednesday, May 16th at 7 p.m., Senior Awards Night is Thursday, May 17th at 7 p.m., and Graduation is Friday, May 18th at 7 p.m. in the High School Gym.
- c. Please remember the next regular meeting of the Board of Education is June 25th (moved from June 11th).
- d. Review of the April 2018 enrollment data and in comparison to April 2017 data.

- b. The Recreational Installations bid to install a new playground system at the Early Childhood Center, in coordination with the ES Educational Foundation, for an amount of \$19,692 was accepted as presented by Dr. Hoehn.
- c. The Jefferson Street Flooring bid in the amount of \$9,950 for removal and replacement of the carpet in the library / computer lab at Elkhorn Elem. was accepted as presented by Dr. Hoehn.
